TO: Dental Providers

SUBJECT: Dental Services Provider Manual Updates

Effective for dates of service on or after July 1, 2024, the South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (SCDHHS) is updating its policy and limitations for prefabricated crowns to align with current clinical guidelines developed by the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD). The policy criteria and limitations updates are described below.

Criteria

Providers are advised that **prefabricated crowns that are placed for the patient's convenience or cosmetic reasons are not covered by the Healthy Connections Medicaid program.**

Providers are responsible for using clinical and professional judgement in alignment with recommended clinical guidelines developed by the AAPD for placement of prefabricated crowns. In addition, when planning extensive treatment and multiple crown placements, providers must evaluate the patient's needs, risk for developing tooth decay, health history and the patient's physical and mental ability to support the extensive treatment.

Limitations

Dental providers must utilize the following procedure codes and limitations when billing for prefabricated crowns.
