**Please explain how these funds will be used to provide a public benefit:**

The Bluffton Jasper County Volunteers in Medicine is the only free medical clinic serving the uninsured in Greater Bluffton and Jasper County. Since it's opening in September of 2011, the clinics continue to not only expand services but annually increase patients visits. In 2011 our patient visits numbered 800, while in 2022 the patient visits numbered 7560. The increase in visits not only reflects the number of unduplicated patients seen but also in the availability of expanded services available at the clinics. Currently we offer primary care, cardiology, gynecology, podiatry, ophthalmology, mental health, and dental care. Due to the increase in our population, we need to expand our clinic in Jasper County. The funds from Proviso 117.21 will help to enlarge our clinic by providing additional exam rooms, separating the administrative area from the nurse's station and provide more waiting room space. In addition, these funds will allow us to update IT systems, develop a stronger accounting system, pay for the increase in utilities and purchase a heat pump. As our clinics grow it is vital that we provide strong board oversight. Funds will also be used to provide additional board education.
