HCBS Provider Phase II Transition FAQ Release

On Sept. 1, the South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (SCDHHS) took the next step in its transition of key Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) responsibilities to the Medicare-Medicaid Plans (MMPs) for HCBS participants in the Healthy Connections Prime program. Phase II was executed and some key functions that were previously performed by SCDHHS have been transitioned to the MMPs, including, but not limited to, service plan approval and monitoring, LTC annual reassessment, provider reimbursement and provider contracts.
