Please explain how these funds will be used to provide a public benefit:

Eighty percent of what a child learns is processed visually. Vision disorders are the most prevalent and treatable condition in children and as many as one in four children has a vision problem. For some diseases/conditions, such as amblyopia, early intervention is vital or vision can be permanently lost in the affected eye. Addressing vision problems during the preschool years can help a child's reading scores increase, his/her classroom performance improve & results in a better overall quality of life. There is a great public benefit to correcting children's vision problems before they enter kindergarten and providing them with the vision tools needed to succeed throughout their academic careers. Through its vision screening & follow-up eye care programs, Sight Savers America (SSA) and screening partner, Impact America, address these problems early on. SSA & Impact America will conduct vision screenings in South Carolina preschools, pre-Ks and Head Starts in a non-invasive manner, which accurately captures refraction data in less than 1 second. Out of the 10-12,000 screened, approximately 1,200 children will fail & need an eye exam. SSA's Follow-up Eye Care Program case manages eye care for children referred, from start to finish. Case managers speak with parents individually about their child's eye care needs & they are educated on the importance of vision health. Through this program, children will receive comprehensive dilated eye exams, eyeglasses, medications, surgeries, low vision services, high-tech low vision aids, other treatments & individual case management support. From initial eye exam to subsequent eye care appointments, SSA establishes an eye care home for recurrent care during a child's formative years.
