A RESOLUTION

APPROVING ASSIGNMENT FROM LIGHTHOUSE GREENVILLE LLC TO THE URBAN LEAGUE OF THE UPSTATE OF THE GROUND LEASE AGREEMENT FOR THE CITY-OWNED PARCEL UPON WHICH THE MCCLAREN MEDICAL SHELTER IS LOCATED (TMS # 0071000100700)

WHEREAS, the city of Greenville ("City") continues its efforts to preserve the City's history, including structures of historical and cultural import, while promoting its future; and

WHEREAS, the City is the owner of that certain parcel of real property consisting of approximately 0.11 acre of land located at the intersection of Academy Street (US Route 123) and Wardlaw Street in the City, Tax Map Number 0071000100700 ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, the structure commonly referred to as the McClaren Medical Shelter ("McClaren Medical Shelter") is owned by Lighthouse Greenville LLC ("Lighthouse") and located on the Property pursuant to the Ground Lease Agreement, dated December 9, 2019, and approved by Ordinance No. 2019-89; and

WHEREAS, Lighthouse desires to donate the McClaren Medical Shelter as well as assign the Ground Lease Agreement to the Urban League of the Upstate ("Urban League"); and

WHEREAS, the McClaren Medical Shelter was founded by Dr. Edward E. McClaren in 1949 to serve the medical and healthcare needs of the City's African American community; and

WHEREAS, the McClaren Medical Shelter is identified in the City of Greenville 2018 Historic Resources Survey as a structure with both local and national significance; and

WHEREAS, the McClaren Medical Shelter is one of the few remaining buildings of African American cultural and historical reference in the City; and

WHEREAS, the McClaren Medical Shelter is of historical and cultural significance to the City such that it should be maintained for the benefit of the public; and

WHEREAS, the Urban League's community-focused mission and commitment to the principle of equal opportunity is in harmony with Dr. McClaren's legacy of care and lifelong dedication to the health and wellbeing of his patients and the Upstate community at large; and

WHEREAS, the City has supported Lighthouse's preservation of one of the City's most significant structures; and

WHEREAS, the City and the surrounding community will benefit from the Urban League's future use, maintenance, and operation of the McClaren Medical Shelter; and

WHEREAS, City Council has determined it is in the interest of the citizens of the City to approve the assignment of the Ground Lease Agreement from Lighthouse to the Urban League;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENVILLE, SOUTH CAROLINA, City Council hereby approves the assignment of the Ground Lease Agreement from Lighthouse Greenville LLC to the Urban League of the Upstate. The City Manager, with advice and counsel of the City Attorney, is authorized to execute such documents and take such additional action as is necessary to effectuate approval of such assignment.


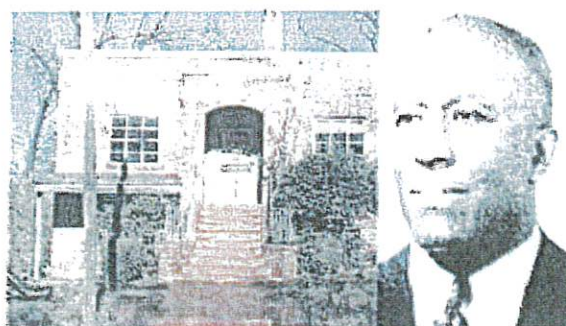

The McClaren Medical Shelter was built in 1949 by Dr. E.E. 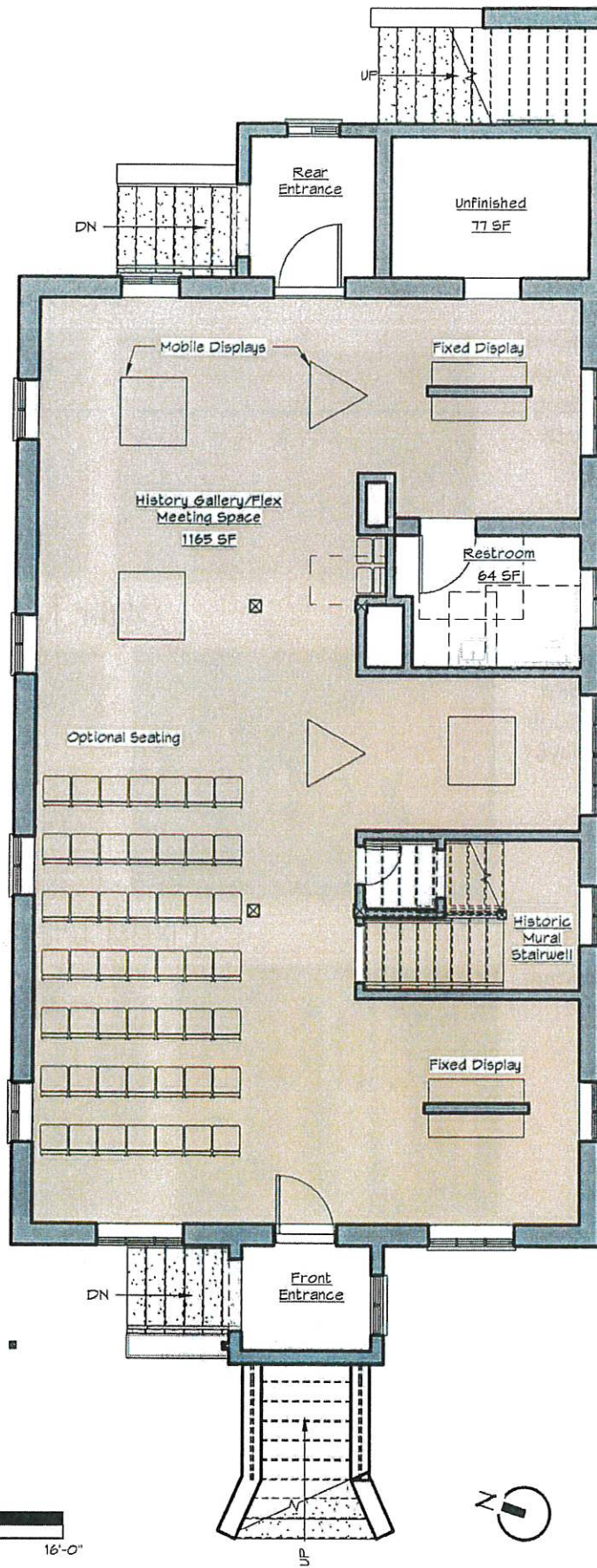
