Sea Haven, Inc., founded in 1980, operates Horry County's ONLY Youth Crisis Center. Sea Haven has embarked on a continuum of youth services to meet the needs of youth in crisis. Sea Haven programs have 4 program components:

1. Sea Haven Youth Crisis Center
2. Project Lighthouse Youth Drop In Center
3. Sea Haven Housing Program
4. Project Safe Place.

The Youth Crisis Center provides residential services to homeless/runaway/displaced youth under the age of 18 with services such as emergency shelter for up to 21 days, individual/family counseling, referrals for services not provided directly by Sea Haven such as general health/medical and dental, mental health, behavioral health, and aftercare/follow up services. The mission of Sea Haven Inc. is "Providing a Safe Place for Youth" In conjunction with our "Project Lighthouse" Youth Drop In Resource Center program which conducts prevention and intervention activities, outreach in the community to identify homeless transitioned aged youth ages 18-24 with safe place, intensive case management and immediate
