1. 2.	Appendix K updates	 SCDHHS has submitted an updated Appendix K request to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) (for all waiver programs). It is currently under review. Read the current flexibilities approved by CMS on the <u>SCDHHS</u> <u>COVID-19 information website</u>. The current request focuses on retainer payments for certain eligible providers in recognition of the need to maintain a viable provider network. 3.	Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Settings Rule – Transition Updates	 CMS issued a letter to state Medicaid director on July 14, 2020, that gave updated guidance on the HCBS rule. CMS is extending the deadline for compliance with the HCBS regulation in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. New full compliance deadline: March 17, 2023 The letter and the revised frequently asked questions can be found on the CMS HCBS website. 						
4.	Home and Community Based (HCB) Settings Quality Review Process: South Carolina Department of Disabilities and Special Needs (SCDDSN) Settings	 CMS issued new deadlines for states to submit settings for CMS' Heightened Scrutiny review in the July 14, 2020, letter and revised frequently asked questions. SCDHHS and SCDDSN are working on new deadlines and timeframes for the HCB Quality Review Process due to the CMS extension. Those dates will be shared once they are finalized. Providers can continue to submit information/evidence packages for settings subject to this process. Information can be sent to Janet Priest at SCDDSN. 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5.	HCBS – Conflict Free Case	 A recorded presentation for waiver participants and families who live in and/or attend settings in this process is available on the SCDHHS HCBS website: On the "<u>Members & Families</u>" page (scroll down to information under "NEW"). SCDHHS and SCDDSN continue to work on plans to prepare for the transition to conflict-free case management in the SCDDSN
	Management (CFCM)	 network of providers. This includes: Compiling a list of policies, manuals, standards and directives that may need to be changed and/or created. Identifying the number of waiver participants impacted by this requirement. Developing a communication plan on this effort for stakeholders.
6.	Long Term Living (LTL) policy updates	 The HCBS settings requirement extension is until March 17, 2023. The CLTC Adult Day Health Care (ADHC) scope of services will be revised October 1, 2020, to reflect that any existing providers not in compliance on April 1, 2023, will have their SCDHHS contract terminated (current policy states April 1, 2022; see below). Current Scope of Services, page 18: Note: CMS requires ADHCs servicing HCBS (Waiver) participants to be in compliance with their settings requirements. Providers of ADHC services must meet all requirements as outlined in 42 CFR § 441.301 (c) (4)). These requirements have been integrated into the CLTC ADHC Provider Manual. Note: Effective April 1, 2022, SCDHHS will terminate contracts with existing ADHC providers whose settings do not meet all of the requirements outlined by CMS for the settings rule.
7.	HCBS Compliance – 2023 and beyond	 As a reminder, CMS is clear: ALL HCB settings <u>must</u> be in compliance by 2023. There is <u>no remediation</u> for any non-compliant setting after that date. If a setting is non-compliant, the state <u>cannot claim</u> federal financial participation (FFP) for any HCB services provided in that setting. Do the work now.
