## WE CARE: Implementing an Intervention to Address Social Determinants of Health in Pediatric Practices

WE CARE study: tests a practice-based intervention to:

- 1) Teach practices to identify local resources and develop resource referral information on six social needs for use at their practices;
- 2) Screen for unmet social needs; and
- 3) Make referrals to the resources



## Summary of Study Design:

- National stepped wedge cluster Randomized Control Trial (RCT) design


## Participants:

- 12 national PROS practices
- PROS practices will enroll up to 180 families at each practice.


## Study Duration:

- July 2018 - April 2022
