QIDA: Quantitative Insight (into) Daily Activities

Practice Level

- Real time practice driven-data
- Describes practice-wide processes
- Highlights areas for practice QI efforts

State Level

- Paints a picture of QI efforts
- Highlights areas for QI efforts

30 practices X 20 charts X 12 months = 7,200 kiddos



QIDA Chart Audits of 7,763 children aged 6 mo. – 6 years, showed us that:

Screening

- 89% -Developmental
- 90% Autism
- 88% Postpartum Depression
- 69% SDoH
 - 12% +for SDoH

Immunizations

- 87% UTD on recommended vaccines
- 66% UTD on flu
- 14% UTD on Covid
- Those NOT –UTD:
 - 50% parent refusals
 - 59% on a catch-up schedule

Oral Health

- 86% oral health exam
- 81% anticipatory guidance documented
- 55% oral health risk assessment
- 41% had fluoride varnish
- 6% had restorative dental (2-6 yr. olds)

Other

- 54% Photometric vison screen (2-4 yr. olds)
- 75% vision screen (5-6 yr. olds)
- 85% appropriate Z code for BMI (5-6 yr. olds)




Overall, QTIP practices audited random charts of 7,763 children aged 6 months to 6 years old.

Based on **documentation** per age groupings:

- √ 95% were up-to-date on WELL CHILD VISITS!
- √ 87% were up-to-date on IMMUNIZATIONS!
- ✓ 69% had a SDoH SCREEN
- √ 88% of new moms had a PPD SCREEN
- ✓ 89% had a DEVELOPMENTAL SCREEN
- ✓ 90% had an AUTISM SCREEN
- √ 54% of had PHOTOMETRIC VISION SCREEN
- √ 75% of had VISION SCREEN



Safe Sleep Fall 2023 Workshop

8-10 weeks ~ September - December

Workshop Purpose:

To increase messaging around Safe Sleep practices for infants by:

- Increasing provider and staff buy-in
- Providing consistent safe sleep screening and counseling
- Providing resource options for families if safe sleep need is identified
- Documenting safe sleep screening and/or counseling in the EMR







Practices will become familiar with the AAP's updated safe sleep guidelines and understand the SIDS/SUID data and the disparities.






Practices QI activities to promote safe sleep may include:

- Distributing Safe Sleep Books
 Discussing safe sleep at childcare
- Documentation of safe sleep conversations
 Pre/post safe sleep knowledge
- Pre/post sare sleep knowledge check
 Connection with MCOs for spec
- Connection with MCOs for specific safe sleep needs
