As a hub for healthy first relationships, we:

- Offer professional IECMH endorsement, certifications and training across all infant- and young child-serving disciplines and systems.
- Provide embedded access to highly trained specialists who mentor early childhood professionals
- Connect caregivers to the resources and professional services critical to babies' well-being
- Advocate for a connected system of care across the state to improve quality of life outcomes for infants

Infant and early childhood mental health.

Put simply, infant and early childhood mental health is healthy social and emotional development. Babies' first five years are filled with tremendous, rapid development. Their early experiences not only affect how their bodies and brains develop, but also drive their well-being and lifelong outcomes.

Strong infant mental health even influences how they will ultimately parent their child.

What we do.

We're committed to promoting racial equity and social justice through our mental health work, and we embed diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) principles into everything we do.





Safe Babies Court

Changing the trajectory for infants and toddlers in child welfare.

This collaborative approach ensures children ages 0-3 and their families within the child welfare system are embraced by a multidisciplinary support team and provided targeted and timely intervention and resources. This trauma-informed model centers infant mental health and supports the well-being of both child and parent. With proven outcomes of expedited permanency, Safe Babies Court reduces the number of days a child lingers in child welfare.



PEAR Network

Building competencies of the adults working with young children.

PEAR Network (Partners for Early Attuned Relationships) is a prevention-based program pairing a highly specialized early childhood mental health consultant with the adults who work with children (ages 0 to 5) to support them as they learn to form secure relationships, manage emotions and explore their environment, particularly child care centers.




Professional Development

From training and certifications to the endorsement credential that elevates IECMH competencies, we help infant- and family-serving professionals hone their skills and strengthen their expertise.



IECMH Clinical Services

Babies don't come with a manual, but we're here to help.

We offer an array of trainings and certifications for infant and early childhood mental health (IECMH) professionals as well as therapeutic treatment and classes for caregivers.

Our trainings are designed to provide professionals who diagnose and provide therapeutic treatment services with in-depth training in relationship-based, developmentally appropriate assessments and an introduction to IECMH clinical practice.

Interventions include: Circle of Security, Attachment Biobehavioral Catch Up, and Child-Parent Psychotherapy
